Administrative/Biographical History - These patterns were collected during Jill Oakes and Rick Riewe's numerous research trips to northern communities. Jill's research documents the factors influencing skin clothing production throughout the circumpolar region and focuses on how information is passed on from one generation to the next, why skin clothing traditions are culturally important, and the role seamstresses play in recording their cultural history into their families' clothing.

Scope and Content: The collection consists of over 200 clothing patterns in a variety of styles created by Inuit artisans to depict differences in clothing styles and construction in various regions of the north. The collection also includes photographs depicting skin preparation and pictorial instructions for measuring and pattern layouts. There is also one artifact. The collection has been divided into four series:

- 1. Patterns
- 2. Photographs
- 3. Artefacts

Custodial History: These patterns were collected by Jill Oakes during her research in support of her MA and PhD. The patterns were created specifically for the research

projects. They were donated to the Clara Lander Library at the Winnipeg Art Gallery in 2010 by Jill Oakes.

Arrangement Notes: For each garment, pattern pieces were stored in a separate plastic envelope, and catalogued in three-ring binders. Some patterns of similar construction were combined in the envelopes.

Restrictions: There are no restrictions on viewing this material however the original creators retain copyright on use of the patterns. Due to their cultural significance, only those of Inuit descent may use them to create clothing items. They are not to be duplicated.

University of Manitoba Archives and Special Collections Jill Oakes fonds

The A.03-123 and A.04-209 accessions consist of materials related to Oakes' research including correspondence, product development and marketing reports for the Minnguq Sewing Group. Also included are numerous artifact cards for the various materials collected by Oakes and her husband, Rick Riewe, on their collecting trips and for display in Oakes' exhibitions. The photograph collection includes one photo album (116 photographs) of the Minnguq Sewing Group of Broughton Island, 76 photographs and 75 negatives from Oakes trip to Denver, Colorado museums in 1997, and 4 VHS and 9 U-matic videocassettes documenting birdskin clothing preparation for the "Coats of Eider" project. Also included are 2 audio cassettes describing the birdskin clothing process. Much of the commentary contained on these audio cassettes is in Inuktitut.

Rick Riewe and Jill Oaks family fonds contains research materials, photographs, and videocassetes that document the creation and displaying of Inuit clothing. Many of the photographs in the fonds are about research trips, teaching, publications, etc related to the north but not specifically to Inuit clothing, but it does provide a rich description of the context in which these items are created.

Photo copies of 160 patterns were donated to the Canadian Museum of History and Inuit Cultural Institute.

Garments at Canadian Museum of History, Manitoba Clothing and Textile Museum, Bata Shoe Musuem. (book on copper and caribou inuit)

Jill Oakes and Rick Riewe family fonds, and the Jill Oakes fonds both contain research materials related to Inuit peoples.

Library has several monographs by Jill Oakes re Inuit clothing.

The George Swinton fonds at the WAG has some images depicting skin preparation and sewing, as well as individuals in traditional clothing.

Bata Shoe Museum has items created by many of the pattern designers in this collection.

Title: Jill Oaks and Rick Riewe Inuit Clothing Patterns Collection

Title: Patterns series **Dates:** 1972-1993

Scope and Content: The over 200 patterns for tradition Inuit clothing were made by artisans throughout the Canadian Artic and Greenland, including older patterns of garments not made today. Many have syllabic notations and instructions written on them. The traditional layout of each pattern piece on caribou, seal, rabbit, or bird and assorted other types of skins is included for most patterns. All patterns include the artisan's name [some appear to be male] and community. Many of these patterns were included in Jill's dissertation and publications.

The patterns in this collection do not represent the traditional method of cutting out material for clothing. Traditionally, seamstresses, through years of training and practice, rely on hand and eye measurements to determine how to cut their sewing material. These patterns were created specifically for the researcher in order to document their distinct styles and construction techniques.

The patterns come in various styles. Most are specific to gender (men's boots, woman's amauit). There are also some age specific items, including children's clothing, as well as doll clothing patterns. The patterns are made of a variety of materials including waxed paper, lined paper, packing paper, maps, newspapers, school paper, stiff paper board, and fabric. There is a pair of seal-skin fur mittens, one of which has had the stitching removed.

One of the pattern artists created the amautiik donated by Drs. Oaks and Riewe: Ulayok Lucy Kaviok. It is possible that the patterns from Grise Fiord are those of the other seamstress whose garment is included in the donation, Tataga Akpaleeapik. It is not known if any of the patterns were used to create any of the three items donated.

Location:

Arrangement notes: A list of patterns and seamstresses was provided but the names and garments did not correspond to the pattern numbers on the packets the patterns were originally stored in. A review noted that the older, crossed-out numbers on the patterns do correspond to the old list. The patterns have been organized according to the newer packet numbers. Several packets of instructions and photographs are organized into a separate series. Several patterns had clear adhesive tape attached to the sides. In most cases, the ends of the tape extending past the pattern piece were cut off to avoid

accidental damage. Where labels were apparent on the pattern pieces (hood; back, etc) they were included. If terms or other writing was apparent but not labels, those terms were included in quotation marks. If there was nothing, then [no name] was affixed to the item. For files that original contained small "model" patterns, these patterns were scanned to a single sheet of paper then placed in an archival envelope inside the original envelope. A copy of the scanned pieces is included in the folder for ease in viewing and ensuring smaller pieces are not overlooked. A digital version of these sheets is kept. All items listed at the item level are pattern pieces unless otherwise indicated. Titles for pattern pieces are taken from writing on the pattern pieces. Some appear to be labels while others appear to be directions. Where both English and Inuktituk are available, the English terms were used, but only because of the arranger's lack of familiarity with Iunktituk.

1.) #1 Amauti/Duffle/Amoutik/drawn by Anita Iblanit.- 1987. [1 folder].

The items described here consist of one Amauti/Duffle/Amoutik pattern drawn by Anita Iblanit of Paalirmiut in Arviat. The pieces are drawn on thin, stiff, white paper. The folder consists of two large panels with multiple pattern pieces drawn on, one instruction sheet, and the original folder label.

Arrangement notes: The two panels were two large for the folders and are housed rolled around a large sheet of map folder paper.

Handling notes: The panels are fragile and brittle. There are tears and wearing on many of the folds. These items were too large for a folder and are rolled around map folder paper.

The items described here consist of one pattern for a shin length Amauti drawn by Anita Iblanit of Paalirmiut in Arviat. The pieces have some sewing notations on them. The folder consists of two pattern pieces, one large sheet of paper with pattern pieces drawn on it, one envelope, and the original folder label.

The items described here consist of patterns for a woman's outer Amauti drawn by M. Katsuak of Tasiujarmiut. Directions for sewing are included on most of the large pieces, including, in some cases, cutting and finished lines for particular individuals. Some of the pattern pieces have bits of fur sticking to them. The folder consists sixteen pattern pieces, five sheets with layout instructions, one envelope with seventeen miniature pattern pieces, and the original folder label.
